Every Story Matters: Carole & John Macaulay

When Carole and John Macaulay moved to Stratford in 2015, they were drawn by the community's charm and its ideal location, allowing them to stay connected to friends in Toronto and family in Goderich and London. What they couldn't have anticipated was how significant a role the Huron Perth Healthcare Alliance (HPHA) – Stratford General Hospital would come to play in their lives.

In November of 2024, the Macaulays made a generous gift of \$50,000 to the Stratford General Hospital Foundation, inspired by their journey with the Cancer and Medical Care Clinic and their gratitude for the extraordinary care they received.

John's care journey began in April of 2024 when symptoms of internal bleeding brought him to the Emergency Department. After being admitted, tests confirmed that he had acute myeloid leukemia, a type of cancer that affects the blood and bone marrow. His initial treatment required a two-week stay in London Health Science Centre's Victoria Hospital, followed by frequent trips back to London for chemotherapy injections. During this time, John was referred to the HPHA - Stratford General Hospital for bloodwork to monitor his condition and assess his need for platelets or infusions. There, he met the local Cancer and Medical Care Team, including Erin Parsons, RN Lead Cancer Care & Medical Outpatient/PICC and Dr. Nicholson. Thanks to Erin's initiative, by August, John was able to receive his chemotherapy injections in Stratford, bringing his care much closer to home.

"John's treatment involved azacitidine injections, a chemotherapy drug that had not been previously

administered at our clinic," says Erin. "I had experience with this treatment from working on inpatient oncology floors. After discussions with our clinical education team and John's oncologist, we received approval to administer the injections here in Stratford."

"Erin worked with the team in Stratford to ensure they could administer the injections I needed, saving us countless trips to London," John explained. "This change gave us our life back," Carole added, reflecting on the freedom and relief they experienced after transitioning John's treatments to Stratford.

The Macaulays deeply appreciated the compassionate and personalized care they received. John highlighted the close-knit, attentive environment.

New Cancer and Medical Care Clinic and Pharmacy Unveiled!

The HPHA proudly celebrated the completion of the Cancer and Medical Care Clinic and Pharmacy with a ribbon-cutting ceremony on January 24, 2025 at Stratford General Hospital. This state-of-the-art facility represents a significant step forward in meeting the needs of patients, offering advanced treatment options in a brighter, more comfortable, and accessible environment.

As a satellite program of the Verspeeten Family Cancer Centre at London Health Sciences Centre, HPHA's clinic serves over 3,500 patient visits annually, including chemotherapy treatments and supportive care for cancers such as breast, prostate, bowel, and lung, among others.

During the unveiling event, attendees had the opportunity to tour the facility and see first-hand how it will enhance care delivery for patients in Perth and Huron Counties. While the clinic's pharmacy was not included in the tour due to the sensitive nature of its operations, it remains an integral part of the new space.

"The investment in pharmacy facilities allows HPHA to adhere to current medication preparation standards for patient and staff safety," says Ryan Itterman, Director, Diagnostics, Regional Pharmacy



and Chemotherapy. "We are proud of the new Cancer and Medical Care Clinic, which will support the growing needs of those we serve in a modern and comfortable setting for years to come," he continued.

Key Highlights of the New Clinic:

- Increased patient consultation and treatment spaces, with 17 upgraded treatment locations now available, up from the previous 12.
- A new negative pressure room to provide care for high-risk patients.
- A specialized Peripherally Inserted Central Catheter (PICC) room for the insertion of central lines for long-term IV medication administration.
- Interior renovation of over 18,000 square feet with new mechanical, electrical, and security systems, as well as updated windows and roofing.

"The unveiling event is an outstanding reminder of the important role the community plays in supporting our ability to provide the highest quality care," says Andrew Williams, HPHA President and CEO. "We now have a world-class facility to complement the world-class care provided day-in, day-out to those in need, and I could not be more proud and appreciative of all those who helped make this a reality."

The Stratford General Hospital Foundation's In Our Hands Capital Campaign has been instrumental in bringing this project to fruition, committing \$15 million of its \$30 million goal to the Cancer and Medical Care Clinic and Pharmacy project.

Josef Frank, Chair of the Stratford General Hospital Foundation Board, stated, "We are honoured to stand with the HPHA as we celebrate the new Cancer and Medical Care Clinic and Pharmacy. This has been a long-held vision, and seeing it come to life through the collaboration of the hospital's leadership, the dedication of our healthcare professionals and the unwavering loyalty from our community is truly remarkable. Without our community's support we have nothing."

Their deep gratitude and admiration for the Cancer and Medical Care Team and a shared desire to support their community inspired their remarkable gift. “As a former nurse and educator, I’m passionate about supporting care and learning,” Carole shared. “We’ve experienced the challenges of cancer care first-hand, and we know how critical it is to have these resources in the community. We hope this gift helps others find the same exceptional care we’ve received.”

In addition to supporting the Cancer and Medical Care Clinic, part of their donation is directed toward staff education, a cause close to Carole’s heart, for the team working in the clinic. “After working as a nurse, teaching became a way for me to help others learn, and I believe that supporting education is key to maintaining excellence in care. Supporting the Foundation is our way of giving back to a team that has done so much for us,” Carole said. “We want to ensure this quality care continues for years to come.”

Carole and John’s story is one of generosity, resilience and love. Both faced serious health

challenges and navigated the healthcare system with determination and optimism. Their partnership, which began serendipitously in a mystery bookshop, was defined by shared values, humour, and an enduring commitment to one another.

Sadly, in January 2025, John passed away due to complications from pneumonia, with Carole by his side. He faced his cancer diagnosis with grace and courage, never losing his calm, kind presence or signature sense of humour. John was a lifelong sports enthusiast, a dedicated runner and yoga practitioner, and someone who found joy in music, fine dining, and greeting every dog he met. He truly lived life with a “glass half full” outlook.

“Carole and John’s gift is a reflection of their incredible compassion and sincerity. It’s a beautiful example of how the care our team provides inspires others to support the work we do,” said Cheryl Hunt, Executive Director, Stratford General Hospital Foundation. “We were deeply saddened to hear of John’s passing, and our hearts are with Carole and their loved ones. It’s an honour to share their story.”

The gift also supported the addition of therapeutic pets and dolls for patients living with dementia. “These items provide a sense of purpose and companionship,” adds Leslie. “Their presence can stimulate memory, lower stress levels and calm an anxious individual. 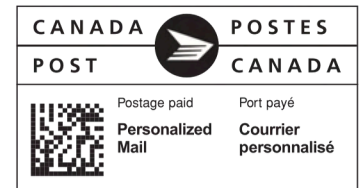
