


The Perfect Image

Stratford General celebrates the arrival of the first new digital x-ray machine. This \$400,000+ machine is funded through our generous donors and replaces an older machine. The new technology emits less radiation, has crisper images and takes only 3 seconds per view. Automated positioning provides accuracy and ease to technicians. A total of four more machines are needed to replace machines that are over a decade old at the cost of \$400,000- \$500,000 each.

Pregnancy And Infant Loss (PAIL)

Did you know that as many as one in five pregnancies end in miscarriage and each year in Canada there are approximately six stillborn infants in 1,000 total births?

We acknowledge and remember these losses, as well as the unique grief that bereaved parents and families experience. "Infant loss at any stage of a pregnancy is an extremely emotional and life changing event, even for the staff involved," says Sherri Haase RN, Team Leader. "The nurses from Maternal Child would like to raise awareness of the prevalence of pregnancy and infant loss and educate others about the impact it has on these families.

Resources include:

Sweater sets/Blankets - Volunteers provide knitted sweaters/hats/booties and blankets for the infants

Books - A children's book explaining death so siblings can understand at their level. The SGH Foundation currently is funding this initiative.

Resource pamphlets - The Pregnancy And Infant Loss (PAIL) Network provides resources for grieving parents.

Footprints - Parents have the option to have their infant's feet foot printed with colourful paint in the shape of a butterfly.

Weighted Teddy Bears - A new initiative, the SGH Foundation provides teddy bears to stuff with weighted material that will match the infant's weight for parents to hold and take home.

Social work follow up and referrals - Offered to all patients experiencing a loss.



Team Players – Thank you

The Surgical Services team along with support staff at Stratford General Hospital have been working diligently to meet the 2018-19 total joint replacement targets. HPHA has committed to completing 369 knees and 204 hips, for a total target number of 573 total joints by March 31st, 2019. As of October 31st, 2018, 58% of the total target cases have been completed. Achievement of this ambitious goal is a direct result of the work of all team members associated with Surgical Services – Surgeons, Anaesthetists, Nursing staff from Surgical Pre-Admit, Day Surgery, OR, PACU and IP Unit, staff from MDRD, Materials Management, Environmental Services, Laboratory, Diagnostic Imaging, Physiotherapists, Rehab Assistants, Porters, Decision Support/Financial Analysts as well as support from the Senior Leadership Team. Bed capacity pressures associated with the increased total joint volumes have impacted other clinical units as well. However, with help from the Bed Allocators, Managers and their staff, the total joint program has been able to continue on its' set course of action. Thanks to all of you, for your diligent and persistent work.

A special 'thank you' also goes out to the Stratford General Hospital Foundation and the generous donations from the community. The purchase of the new System 8's which includes saws, drills and accessories, has improved the work life of the staff and enhanced the quality of care the surgical team can provide to our patients.
