

Every Story Matters. Lori-Jo: Lorene & John Donaldson

Lorene Donaldson was a wife, mother, grandmother, artist, and businesswoman. Born in Stratford in 1931, Lorene balanced a life full of creativity and hard work. Together with her husband, John, they ran the Lori-Jo Supermarket for over 25 years, becoming well-known in the community.

In 2021, Lorene was diagnosed with vascular dementia and heart failure. She and John moved to a care village in Waterloo, where Lorene received compassionate care until her passing in June 2022. Their 65-year marriage, defined by deep love and partnership, inspired John to make a difference in dementia care.

John's gift to the Huron Perth Healthcare Alliance (HPHA) - Stratford General Hospital honours Lorene's memory by supporting staff training and technology to enhance care for patients with dementia. This donation will provide tools like a WanderGuard system and sensory murals, helping caregivers understand and support patients more deeply.


As John says, "We're giving back to the community because it's what Lorene would have wanted.

We're 95% of the way there, but we need your help to reach our goal and ensure the hospital can continue providing the best care possible for everyone.



Highlights from the HPHA: Stratford General Hospital

Expansion of Ontario Breast Screening Program

People in Ontario ages 40 - 49 are now included in the Ontario Breast Screening Program (OBSP). It's estimated that this will help more than 305,000 people with an additional 130,000 mammograms that can be completed annually. The HPHA - Stratford General Hospital is a proud OBSP certified site and our Mammography team is ready to assist.

"This expansion will allow for participants to self-refer to any OBSP screening location. This will create easier access to breast screening for all individuals within this population. At all ages, there are many potential benefits of regular breast screening. Regular screening may find a breast cancer early. This could mean that treatment may be less intensive or invasive, it may have a better chance of working, and the risk of a fatal outcome due to breast cancer is reduced." - Lauryn, Senior Technologist, Breast Assessment Centre.

Masking in Clinical Areas Returns

HPHA has updated masking guidelines ahead of the respiratory season in anticipation of increased spread of influenza, RSV (respiratory syncytial virus) and COVID-19. Masking is currently in effect and required when in any clinical area of our hospitals and recommended, but not required, in non-clinical areas. Visit **www.hpha.ca** for full details.

HPHA Recognized by Ontario Health for Achievements in Organ & Tissue Donation

The HPHA is proud to announce its recognition by Ontario Health's Trillium Gift of Life Network for outstanding support in organ and tissue donation. HPHA received the Hospital Achievement Award - Provincial Conversion Rate. The conversion rate is the percentage of potential organ donors who went on to become actual donors. This honour emphasizes the HPHA's commitment to saving and enhancing lives through the gift of donation, a vital aspect of healthcare in Ontario. Did you know that only 35% of eligible Ontarians are currently registered as organ and tissue donors. Anyone 16 years or older with a valid Ontario health card can register – either in person at any ServiceOntario location or online at www.beadonor.ca. Register to donate and speak with your family about your wishes.



One organ donor can save up to 8 lives and enhance as many as 75 others through the gift of tissue.
